Dear Parents:

We hope you have been enjoying time with your children this past month. Summer always seems to get away from us before we know it!

Central Catholic will have orientation for students on August 9. Each class will meet at their assigned time to discuss the upcoming school year and handbook changes, and to ask questions, etc. Student pictures will be taken following their meeting. Seniors will meet at 8:00, Juniors at 9:00, Sophomores from 10:00 – 11:00, Freshmen from 11:00 – 12:00, Eighth graders from 12:00 – 1:00 and finally the Seventh graders from 1:00 – 2:00.

We have been working to merge Guardian Angels and Central Catholic on Sycamore Education. "Sycamore" is our recordkeeping system that you can use to access your child/children's progress, among many other things, such as calendar events, "News Flash" events, menu, contact information, etc. To log on to Sycamore, go to www.sycamoreeducation.com. The school ID # is 1189. We are enclosing your family user name and password which gives you access to all of your children's information. Each child will receive a user name and password at the beginning of the school year which gives them access to their own records exclusively. (Grade 10-12 student user names and passwords should be the same as last year.)

The CC fall events calendar has been entered on the Sycamore calendar. Remember that some information is subject to change as the school year approaches.

As in the past, you will be getting separate tuition statements for Guardian Angels and Central Catholic. The statements will appear differently from the past. This year we have listed the numbers used to arrive at the tuition total, such as cost to educate each student and credits for Parish subsidy and Livestock Feeders grant amounts. Your bottom line should still be the total of tuition plus bookbill for your student(s). Grades 9-12 total should be \$2450.00, 7-8 total \$1890.00. Applications for free/reduced lunch will be sent at a later date.

Deanne has enclosed confirmation letters for families that have opted for Electronic Fund Transfer for tuition payments. Please let her know if changes should be made.

Dress Code: Please remember that changes for the 2010-2011 year dress code include:

- Black, Kahki, Navy Pants, Capri Pants, Shorts. (**No Cargo Pants**)
- Black, Kahki, Navy Shorts. (Cargo Shorts **are** acceptable for 2010-11 School year)
- Black or Brown Belt
- Undershirt (If Undershirt is Worn) must be white with no writing.
- Maroon, Navy, Black Polo (Plain No Logos)

Booster Club:

The booster club has graciously donated approximately \$160 per student this year so we did not have to raise family tuition by \$160. Every family benefits from this generous gift. Hair Cuts: (Including August 9 orientation)

Hair cut policy is essentially the same as last year above the collar, above the ears, above the eyebrows. Students, including seniors, will be expected to have the approved hair cut for the composite pictures taken on orientation day.

Orientation Day Picture Dress Code:

Students (including seniors) will be expected to have school approved hair cuts. T-shirts / shirts with writing, such as Aeropostale, Hollister, etc., are not acceptable because the pictures are part of the composite and are representative of Central Catholic. Business casual tops, such as collared shirts or polo shirts for boys; For girls business casual tops that cover the shoulders (no spaghetti straps), are not extreme in neckline (not extremely low cut) and have no writing on them are acceptable. Students whose dress or haircut falls outside these guidelines will not have their picture taken on orientation day and will have to be photographed during retakes.
